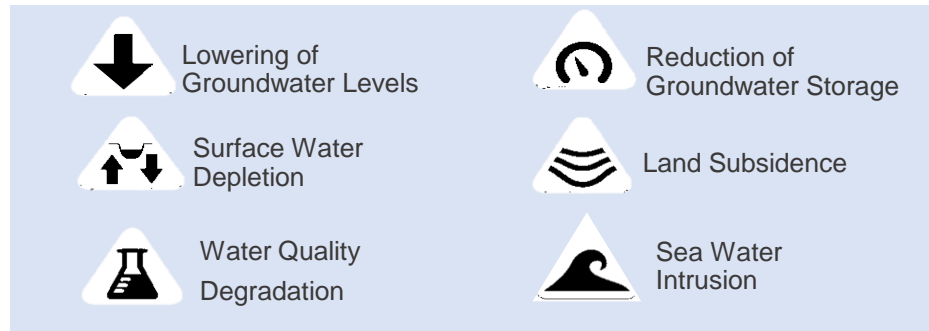

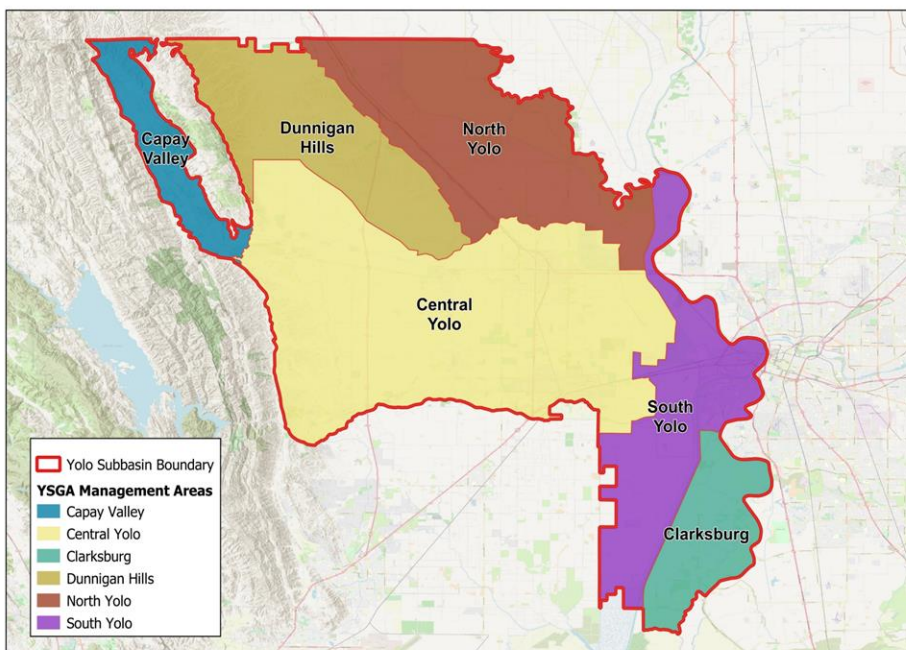
Sustainable Groundwater Management Act

In 2014, California enacted the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (**SGMA**) to better manage groundwater for long-term sustainability. Sustainability is achieved by avoiding significant and unreasonable conditions for these six **sustainability indicators**:



The Yolo Subbasin Groundwater Agency (YSGA) was formed June 2017 to serve as the Groundwater Sustainability Agency for the Yolo Subbasin. Since 2017, the YSGA has focused on developing the Yolo Subbasin Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP). The 2022 Yolo Subbasin GSP considers all beneficial users and defines a **sustainability goal** for the Yolo Subbasin.

DWR is currently reviewing the Yolo Subbasin GSP for compliance with SGMA and will provide approval by 2024. The adopted 2022 Yolo Subbasin GSP can be found at <https://www.yologroundwater.org/yolo-subbasin-groundwater-sustainability-plan>. **The primary goal is to retain local control in ensuring sustainable groundwater supplies into 2042 and beyond.**
