FY2010-11 Project Funding Recommendations

Recommendations

Receive and adopt as part of the FY2010-11 WRA Budget the project funding recommendations by the Technical Committee.

Background

The WRA TC meets monthly to implement Board priorities with a focus on making progress on actions contained in the 2007 IRWMP and developing strategies to pursue and secure outside funding opportunities. The TC also provides annual recommendations to the Board on the proposed allocation of the non-administrative portion of the WRA budget.

FY2010-11 WRA Budget - Project Funds Allocation Recommendations

Table 1 below lists the projects the TC has reviewed and recommended for WRA funding as part of the FY2010-11 WRA budget. All of the projects are related to actions contained in the Yolo County IRWMP. Historically the WRA funding has been leveraged almost 2/1 with local funds to facilitate implementation of a wide range of WRA priority actions.

The actual local cost share leveraging will not be known until the end of the FY when various factors unfold and more certainty about overall funding approaches has been identified. The administrative and legal support services position the WRA to respond to state-oriented initiatives and policy matters.

Recent TC Highlights:

- Developed FY2010-11 WRA project funds budget recommendations for Board consideration;
- Received status updates from the eight (8) IRWMP Integrated Action lead partners;
- Developed ten (10) tables to document IRWMP progress since 2007 including actions completed, action milestone progress, and new actions. This information will be presented to the Board in a suitable format in the near future;
- Continued Prop. 84 IRWMP related collaboration process with regional partners to maintain readiness for upcoming funding opportunities;
- Monitoring status of various project funding sources (e.g. AB 303, Prop. 50, Prop. 84), however exact funding release dates for various state funding programs still subject to change;
- Received annual update on the Yolo County Groundwater Monitoring Program including overall conditions, accomplishments and update on drought index tracking conditions;
- Monitored and participated in 2009 water legislation process and assessed impacts for WRA member agencies and stakeholders (special thanks to YCFCWCD and Yolo County);
- Staying abreast of progress on Bay-Delta Conservation Plan and related processes;
- Monitored RWQCB process to amend basin plan for Delta methylmercury TMDL related to Cache Creek;
- Received presentation on the Sacramento River Watershed Program's recently developed webbased mapping and project information management system called SWIM - the Sacramento Watershed Information Module.
